## EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT REPORT

---

I did my Eagle Scout project about 6 years ago, December of 2009. The office building of a charity organization called Mesa United Way is located at 137 E. University Drive, Mesa, AZ 85201. Their mission is to unite the community and improve the lives of others that are in need. The goal behind my Eagle Project was to give life to the building in such a way that represents the life that Mesa United Way gives to others. Before I began, Mesa United Way had no nature around it whatsoever, as a matter of fact, when the building was first constructed, the irrigation system was defective and unused for over 10 years. The vision was to turn the building from bare, rocks, and rubble, to green, beauty, and full of life.

My project wasn't as simple as adding plants to the building. The immensity of it wasn't fully understood until the project was started. Through a series of steps such as replacing the sprinkler timer, the main commercial sprinkler valve, and repairing over 50 leaks in the underground irrigation pipe system, water was able to flow around the circumference of the building effectively. In addition to sustaining the new plant life, bubbler heads were installed and the entire system was adjusted at each plant to accommodate the water flow, requiring several follow up visits over the course of three months.

My project consisted of a team of 20 volunteers (Fellow scouts, scout leaders, Mesa United Way volunteers, friends, and family), contributing to a total of over 200 volunteer hours towards the project. On top of the volunteer hours, donations were received from A&P Nurseries, Ewing, Hunter, and Fresh & Easy. The project was valued at about \$900, which was successfully covered by donations, because of the required parts such as the sprinkler timer, sprinkler valve, bubbler lines, bubbler caps, and so on.

Twelve lantanas were added to the building and approximately 90 petunias were arranged in the pattern of the Mesa United Way logo by the front door. Six years later, a few petunias, which are seasonal flowers, have been lost, but the lantanas are still alive and well to this day, continuing to give beauty to the charity building.
